

Dear family and friends,

23 June 2007

We arrived in Nairobi on Sunday night June 17 with 11 of our 12 trunks...the "stray" trunk arrived 2 days later because it never made it on the flight with us from Chicago. We were greeted with the familiar smells and sounds of Nairobi along with welcoming hugs from our teammates Dan and Connie Crum. I don't know who was happier to see each other...our black lab or the girls! We were too wired to go to bed at midnight...was close to 3 am before we could all settle down.

Wednesday we moved our personal belongings from a locked storage room inside the home of friends. We realized when starting to sort thru boxes, etc that we were missing things! Missing are the chop saw, sewing machine, CD players, Lynn's tote of "handy man" tools, Leslie's green duffle bag, and a few other small items. We felt deflated and so frustrated!! Gaining our focus we realized that these are material possessions that can be replaced. We need to learn the lessons of forgiveness and letting go of the earthly things to allow more of the Godly character to be developed in us. I wish it were easier.

Meanwhile we are unpacking and getting our home set up, adjusting to life in Kenya. Lynn is working on finding internet service for us along with other logistical things. I will try emailing from a coffee house until we have access at home.

Tuesday Lynn and I plan to go downtown to renew our alien registration cards. Pray that this will just be routine as it should be...no surprises. Please also pray that we will be able to have the re-entry visa stamped in Leslie and Cara's passports without complications. This should also be routine, however Cara's has a twist. We had to report Cara's passport lost this spring when it never returned from Kenya with the rest of the family's to have this re-entry visa stamped in it. The US government has stamped inside her new passport that the first one was reported lost/stolen. We pray the Kenyan government will recognize this as valid (which it is) and will not require a letter in addition to what is stamped in her passport...this is just added frustration as we will have to deal with the US embassy and possible red tape.

All for now...more will come later. I just wanted to let you know we are back in Kenya. Thank you so much for your prayers and financial support...God uses each of us in different ways to build His Kingdom.
